Near Lincoln and Leland avenues, German and American food and drinks will be served along with live entertainment to celebrate the traditional German celebration of spring's arrival. **Festival hours are 5-9:30 p.m. Thursday**, **5-10 p.m. Friday**, **12-10 p.m. Saturday and 12-10 p.m. Sunday**.
